Subject/Qualification	BTEC Tech Award in Enterprise (Pearson Examination Board)

Component 3: Marketing and Finance for Enterprise will be assessed through a two hour examination.

A knowledge of businesses and their processes is extremely useful in many different jobs including roles within the administration, accountancy, banking and finance, marketing, human resources, retail sales and customer services sectors. It will also be useful if you are thinking about setting up your own business or being self-employed in the future. It can also lead to Further and Higher Education and the studying of a degree in an associated area.
