

#### Change and continuity

#### Significance

### Interpretations

How are events from the past remembered? Why do different people, writing at different times, have different versions of the same event? How do we know which interpretation to believe?



## Cause and consequence

What causes major, world-changing events? Why do events happen at the time that they do, and not before or after? What impact do these eventshave on the future?

#### Similarity and difference

How do different events/ groups/ periods compare with each other? Do similarevents always have the same impact? Do different events share similar causes?
