


Background information


The Black Death originated in China in the early to mid-1300s and spread along trade routes westward to Northern Africa and the Mediterranean. It reached southern England in 1348 and northern Britain and Scandinavia by 1350. It was caused by the bacterium *Yersinia pestis* and was transmitted from rodents to humans by the bite of infected fleas.



Secondary interpretation/ debate about period

"Such a dramatic and sustained fall in population levels brought **distinct benefits for ordinary people**. On the whole, English men and women ate more meat and dairy produce than before and, in a rental market that favoured tenants rather than landlords, they were able to afford better quality housing. The sanitary reforms introduced by urban authorities also made towns and cities cleaner and more pleasant places to live – or at least aimed to do so." Professor Carol Rawcliffe
