Welcome back to a new half term as we head into the winter months we know pupils are more likely to want to be off during this time as the days get darker earlier and the temperatures drop. It is even more important that we continue to drive attendance and punctuality up though, we finished the last half term with a whole school attendance of 94.32% this is up from 90.79% which we finished with in July. Attending school is so important for the pupils as it will support with: Developing their wellbeing, Making friends in school who can support them both in school and outside of school, Ensure they obtain the knowledge and information from all their subjects to access homework and exams during their time at Holly Lodge, Achieve the best outcomes at the end of Y11 and sixth form as well as on other tests during their time at Holly Lodge to enable them the opportunity to achieve professional careers.

Pupils need to aim for attendance above 95% which means no more than 8 days off over the whole academic year. Pupils that are often ill and off school run the risk of being persistently absent, "Persistently absent from school means

your child has an attendance of below 90%. The Department for Education defines a pupil as persistently absent if they miss one in ten school sessions. (Every school day consists of two "sessions" – a morning and an afternoon). If your child has 19 days off over the school year, they will always remain below 90% and be classes as a PA pupil from school."

Pupils being at school will provide them with the best opportunities of being successful not just at school but in life. Pupils who have ambitions to have nice cars and houses while enjoying beautiful holidays need to ensure they attend school. This will help them be successful and achieve all of their life goals.
