This table shows the current attendance for each year group in relation to what we finished at last year. All year groups are up and in some cases over by 1.5%. Year 11 have shown a huge upturn in their attendance up by 5.35% which is really positive as they approach their examinations in May. In relation to the national data the current average attendance figure for the whole of the UK is 93% but currently Holly Lodge is above as we sit at 94.13% so up by 1.13%! This is testament to the hard work and support of both the pupils and our families for which we are truly thankful. We still want to push on though and shift the whole school attendance to above 95% which I believe we can achieve. I have been doing assemblies to each year group over the past week and I have spoken about why attendance is important both in school and beyond Holly Lodge and in employment, I have made the link between attendance and being successful so they can enjoy successful careers which allows for an above average salary which in turn will enable them
